Section 4: First aid measures

4.1 First-aid measures

6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Methods for containment:

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Cover powder spill with a plastic sheet or tarp to minimize spreading. Dike far ahead of liquid spill for later disposal.

Methods for cleaning up:

Use personal protective equipment as required. Cover powder spill with a plastic sheet or tarp to minimize spreading and keep the powder dry. Take up mechanically, placing in appropriate containers for disposal. Avoid creating dust. Clean contaminated surfaces thoroughly. Soak up with inert absorbent material. Dam up. Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers. Sweep up and shovel into suitable containers for disposal. After cleaning, flush away traces with water. Take precautionary measures against static discharges.
